# **EDITORIAL**

When the bundle was nestled in her arms and she moved the fold of cloth to look upon his tiny face, the mother gasped. The baby had been born without ears.

Time proved that the baby's hearing was perfect. It was only his appearance that was marred. When he rushed home from school one day and flung himself into his mother's arms, she sighed, knowing that his life was to be a succession of heartbreaks. He blurted out the tragedy. "A boy, a big boy ... called me a freak."

He grew up, handsome for his misfortune. A favourite with his fellow students, he might have been class president, but for that. He developed a gift, a talent for literature and music. "But you might mingle with other young people," his mother reproved him, but felt a kindness in her heart. The boy's father had a session with the family physician. Could nothing be done? "I believe I could graft on a pair of outer ears, if they could be procured," the doctor decided.

Where upon the search began for a person who would make such a sacrifice for a young man. Two years went by. Then, "You are going to the hospital, Son. Mother and I have someone who will donate the ears you need. But it's a secret," said the father. The operation was a brilliant success, and a new person emerged. His talents blossomed into genius, and school and college became a series of triumphs.

Later he married and entered the diplomatic service. "But I must know!" He urged his father, "Who gave so much for me? I could never do enough for him." "I do not believe you could," said the father, "but the agreement was that you are not to know...not yet." The years kept their profound secret, but the day did come...one of the darkest days that a son must endure. He stood with his father over his mother's casket. Slowly, tenderly, the father stretched forth a hand and raised the thick, reddish-brown hair to reveal that the mother had no outer ears. "Mother said she was glad she never let her hair be cut," he whispered gently, "and nobody ever thought Mother less beautiful, did they?"

Real beauty lies not in the physical appearance, but in the heart. Real treasure lies not in what that can be seen, but in what that cannot be seen. Real love lies not in what that is done and known, but in what that is done but not known.

May you have a beautiful heart that is moved by compassionate love to lift up the spirits of the deprived, dejected and the demoralised.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle - Albert Einstein

The members of Pudu are a wonderful lot and are performing miracles everyday; I am in awe and humbled by the experience in their presence.

The Organising Chairman of the Fund Raising Committee VP Heng, put together a remarkable feat within *six weeks* or thereabout to organise and orchestrate this project and see it to its fruition. He is within a hair's breadth from his target of RM85,000.00 to be raised for the external funding we need for the coming year.

If I contrast this experience with one of my own when I took on an 'unplanned' project to raise RM140,000 for scholarship in the year 2009 by writing, editing and publishing the book 'A Judge's Journey Through Mother Earth'. The experience there was starkly different.

Two main differences are:

- 1 The said book which was based on the judgments of the late Mr Justice Dato Vincent Ng, took *six months* to prepare. Mobilising about eight counsels, we had to prepare the same from conception to 'conveyor belt'. In the instant fund raising through a movie, we need not take any part in the production of the movie at all.
- 2 95% of the donors for the book were non-Pudu Rotarian lawyers; and in the instant fund raising the donors are 90% Pudu Rotarians or their friends.

In hindsight, for economy I would have preferred a fund raiser through a movie; but for the opportunity to write a book as a tribute to the late Mr Justice Dato Vincent Ng, launched by the now Chief Justice Tun Arifin Zakaria in the presence of many judges, I would have chosen the latter.

For the present project, "well done" Organising Chairman Vice President Heng.

His Excellency Marco V. Balarezo arrived in Kuala Lumpur in April 2012 upon appointment as the Ambassador to Malaysia.

Most recently, Ambassador Balarezo served as Deputy Minister at Ministry of Defence in Peru.

His prior assignments include Director General Chief of Cabinet and Staff of the Minister of Foreign Relations, Director General of World Trade Organization (WTO) and International Economic Negotiations and Deputy Director of the Andean Countries Affairs of the Andean Community of Nations at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

During his temporary leave from the diplomatic

service, Ambassador Marco Balarezo was Deputy Regional Representative of Americas at the United Nations World Tourism Organization; with headquarters in Madrid, Spain (2006-2008).

His overseas postings include Deputy Permanent Representative of Peru to the United Nations in New York, where he was elected Chairman of the Second Committee (Economic and Financial) of the 59 General Assembly. He also served as Economic and Commercial Counsellor in the Embassy of Peru in Chile and as Secretary in the Embassy of Peru in the United States



















Nazca Culture: 100 BC – 800 AD

# Do not send this form to Rotary International; forms sent to RI will not be processed.

District Governors must report the names of the qualifying Interact clubs in their districts online through Member Access no later than 15 April 2014.

### Activities

Meet at least twice each month.

Assign each club member a specific role, either as a club leader or as a member of a committee or project team.

Participate in at least one activity that promotes international understanding.

Participate in a school or community service project or fundraiser that supports one of Rotary's areas of focus. For ideas, consult *Rotary's Areas of Focus* (965).

Use social networking sites (eg Twitter or Facebook) to promote club activities.

Collaborate with one of Rotary's service partners, such as YSA.

Participate in a career day activity or mentoring activity.

# Rotarians work in places that terrify government officials

Rotarians work in places that terrify government officials - Says The New York Times in an article "Pakistan Battles Polio, and Its People's Mistrust"

The country's new determination has also brought Rotary International back to the front lines.

The club, founded in Chicago in 1905, started the global polio eradication drive in 1988. It has had chapters in what is now Pakistan since 1927, and is now led by Aziz Memon, a hard-driving textile magnate.

Mr. Memon, 70, and other Rotary-affiliated executives have used their money and political connections to keep the pressure on. They compensated the killed vaccinators' relatives and held news conferences at which the families urged others to continue fighting.

Rotarians also work in places that terrify government officials. In an industrial neighborhood in Karachi, where both gangs and the Taliban hold sway after dark, Abdul Waheed Khan oversaw a Rotary polio clinic in his school, Naunehal Academy. A big, gregarious man, he angered the Taliban by admitting girls to his academy and offering a liberal arts education instead of only Koran study. His only security was local teenagers who

ride motorcycles beside his car to keep anyone from pulling up alongside.

In March, he hosted Dr. Robert S. Scott, the 79-year-old Canadian chairman of Rotary's polio committee, who flew in to vaccinate children to prove that the fight would go on despite the December killings

"I had a fatwa put on my head," Mr. Khan said in April as he led a tour of the clinic. "They said I was Jewish. I had a friend issue a counter-fatwa saying I was a good Muslim."

On May 13, Mr. Khan was killed by gunmen who also wounded his 1-year-old daughter.

His clinic will not close. "No one can replace Waheed, but life has to go on," Mr. Memon said.

# The world loses one of the "true heroes" of polio eradication

24 July 2013 - Ali Maow Maalin, recently described as being one of the "true heroes" of polio eradication, passed away on Monday in his home district of Merka, Somalia, due to sudden illness.

The last person to be infected with naturally occurring smallpox anywhere in the world, Mr Maalin was struck with the virus in 1977 whilst working as a cook at a Merka hospital. Fearing the needle would be painful, he'd previously avoided vaccination by holding his arm when vaccinators came to visit, pretending he'd already received the shot. But after recovering from the potentially deadly illness, he vowed not to let others make the same mistake.

Mr Maalin used his story to illustrate the importance of vaccination and became an important advocate for polio eradication in Somalia, playing an instrumental role in its defeat of the disease in 2008: "Somalia was the last country with smallpox. I wanted to help ensure that we would not be the last place with polio too," he told the BBC at the time.

A district polio officer, he died on the second day of the polio eradication vaccination campaign he was conducting in Merka district, part of the Supplementary Immunization Activities taking place 21-25 July in response to the current outbreak. A profile of Mr Maalin's work escribed him as one of the eradication programme's "most valuable local polio coordinators".

### A sudden outbreak of Polio in Somalia

Somalia hadn't had a case of polio for nearly six years. But in the past few months, the virus has come back. Now the East African country has the worst polio outbreak anywhere in the world.

20 new cases of polio were this week in Somalia by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. That brings the total number of cases in the Horn of Africa to 73. The rest of the world combined has tallied only 59 cases so far this year.

Health workers are worried that the virus could gain a foothold in the Horn of Africa and jeopardize the multi-billion dollar effort to wipe out the virus worldwide.

Until this recent outbreak, global efforts to eradicate polio appeared to be making remarkable progress. Last year the number of children paralyzed by polio hit a record low at 223.

This year it was looking like there were going to be even fewer cases. The last significant pockets of the virus appeared to be isolated in Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria.

There are about 18,400 species of wildlife on the island, with more than 20% being rare or endangered species. Among these are the land-locked salmon, Taiwan serow, Formosan rock monkey, Formosan black bear, blue magpie, Mikado pheasant, and Xueshan grass lizard.

# **Endgame strategy**

Bruce Aylward, assistant director-general for Polio, Emergencies and Country Collaboration at the World Health Organization — a GPEI partner — said that the finish line for polio eradication is in sight, but cautioned that "it is one thing to see the finish line; it is another to cross it."

Sharing details of the latest polio eradication strategic plan, he said the plan is historic in finally setting out the endgame, the final steps needed to wipe out polio.

"We now have the plan to complete the program of PolioPlus," Aylward said. "And we have the backing of you, Rotarians around the world, to get the job done."

Actress Archie Panjabi, a Rotary polio eradication ambassador, recounted how, as a 10-year-old living in India, she had seen children crawling along the streets, propelled only by their hands. The image troubled her for years. When she was asked to join Rotary's This Close campaign in 2011, she said she realized that the children she'd seen were polio victims, and that by working to eliminate polio, she could help prevent others from suffering in that way.

"I came to realize that we still have work to do, and how important it is for people like me — people like you — to use our voices to raise awareness of, and support for, the global effort to eradicate polio," Panjabi said. "As a Rotary polio ambassador, I will continue to do whatever I can to spread the word."


