

Some Dos and Don'ts

- 1. Do not lie a Refrigerator on its back when transporting.
- 2. Always Switch off the current when you want to change a bulb or check an electrical item.
- 3. Always Read the Instruction manual before instal or fix an Electrical item.
- 4. Never repair a water heater when you are not an qualified Technician.
- 8.Clean your air cond Filters regularly, you will not have water leaking from the indoor unit. The fine dust and the discharge water gel easily stucked in the indoor unit's grill case.
- 9. When you require any extension wire core, choose one with 40 wires thickness.
- 10. Only buy Plugs, Extension cores, accessories with SIRIM approval/chop

- 5. Overloading your washing machine will damage the Shaft / Suspension.
- 6. You can use the washing machine a few times a day provided ,you allow the machine rest for 10 to 20 minutes everytime after used.
- 7. Switch off the power at the electrical socket for your LCD, LED, PLASMA TV as the standby light is on. The TV power is virtually on.



ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARDS

18 - 22 December 2013, AIMST University, Sungai Petani, Kedah

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards or RYLA as it is popularly known began as an idea in Australia in 1959. There was a group of young people from the state of Queensland, Australia who were selected to meet up with Princess Alexandra, a young cousin of Queen Elizabeth . The Rotarians of Brisbane, who hosted these participants were impressed with their quality of these young people and it was decided to bring youth leaders together each year for a week of social, cultural and educational activities. The RYLA program gradually grew throughout all the Rotary Districts in Australia and New Zealand. In 1971, the RI Board officially adopted RYLA as an official program of Rotary International.

Every year, thousands of young adults from the age of 18-30 attend these seminars in almost all the 500 odd Rotary districts throughout the world. They spend a week together in a challenging program of leadership training, discussions, inspirational addresses and social activities which are designed to enhance personal development, leadership skills and good citizenship.

RYLA is generally conducted as a District activity though there are times when it is held as an Inter-district or as a multi-district event. This is yet another meaningful program of RI in the service of Youth.

"I'm aware of that and you're not going to change my mind, so please book me in to be castrated or I'll simply use another doctor."


"Well, OK.", says the doctor, "But I'll have you know that it's against my better judgment!"
