SPEAKER'S TEXT

To all Rotary clubs in Zone 6B

Dear fellow Rotarians:

Report of your Nominating Committee for Director of Rotary International

In accordance with the provisions of RI bylaws section 12.020., the nominating committee for director in Zone 6B recently certified that it has nominated Rotarian Mir Anisuzzaman, a member of the Rotary Club of Agrabad, Bangladesh, as a director of RI for 2015-17. Rotarian Anisuzzaman has stated that he is willing and able to serve as a director, if elected.

The RI president will declare Rotarian Anisuzzaman the sole official director-nominee from your zone on 1 December 2013, unless, prior to that date, another qualified Rotarian has been duly proposed as a challenging candidate. To bring about such a challenge, a club in the zone must submit a resolution to the district governor, signed by the club president or secretary, naming a candidate who was previously suggested to the nominating committee. The governor, either at the district conference or through a postal ballot, will ask each club in the district whether it concurs with the challenge. If a majority of the clubs in that district concur, the governor will forward the challenge to the general secretary by 1 December 2013, either to one of RI's international offices or to World Headquarters, along with copies of all concurrences. Please note that the resolution and concurrences must be received by the general secretary by 1 December 2013. Any challenges that are not complete or that arrive after 1 December cannot be considered. A ballot listing the choice of the nominating committee and any challenging candidates will then be prepared and mailed to all clubs in the zone by 31 December 2013.

Your attention is directed to RI bylaws section 10.060., which in part states that

Rotarians shall not campaign, canvass, or electioneer for elective position in RI, or allow any such activity, either on their behalf or on behalf of another. No brochures, literature, letters, or other materials, including electronic media and communications, may be distributed or circulated by Rotarians or on their behalf to any clubs or members of clubs except as may be expressly authorized by the board.

Any candidate who undertakes, or on whose behalf is undertaken, unauthorized and improper activities to further his candidacy is in violation of the RI bylaws and may be disqualified. The Board of Directors of RI intends that these provisions shall be strictly observed.

On 24 October, we mark World Polio Day. It is a time to reflect on the progress we've made and to strengthen our determination for the work ahead. It's important to realize how far we've come. We have reduced the number of polio cases by over 99 percent, from more than 350,000 a year in the 1980s to 223 in 2012. But now for the road ahead: Polio is still endemic in Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan. Difficult terrain, civil unrest, remote settlements, and poor sanitation are just some of the obstacles to immunization. That's why we, and our partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, are determined to finish our work

With the announcement of the extended fundraising partnership between Rotary International and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation at the 2013 RI Convention in Lisbon. Portugal, we have the chance to introduce millions of new dollars into the campaign. The value of this extended partnership is more than \$500 million, and through it, your contributions toward polio eradication will work twice as hard. It's more important than ever that we all take action. Talk to your government leaders, share your polio stories on your social networks, and encourage others in your community to join us in supporting this historic effort. When Rotarians combine their passion for service with our strong global network, we are unstoppable. With the backing of the Gates Foundation and you, the Rotarians around the world, we can change the face of public health forever.

Opening the door to polio eradication

It's been more than two years since the last polio case was reported in Côte d'Ivoire. Time enough for people to become complacent about immunizations. But that would be a mistake – a potentially deadly mistake.

"The public sometimes doesn't understand why, after so many rounds of polio immunization, they are still being asked to bring their children to the immunization post," says Marie-Irène Richmond-Ahoua, chair of Rotary's National PolioPlus Committee in Côte d'Ivoire.

As a long-time advocate for polio eradication, Richmond-Ahoua knows you can't let up against this tenacious and crippling disease. With Nigeria one of three remaining polio-endemic countries, the possibility of fresh outbreaks in Côte d'Ivoire is a constant threat. The only way to keep the poliovirus out of the country are regular immunizations of all children under age five.

During National Immunization Days (NIDs) in April, thousands of volunteers and health workers, together with Rotary and Rotaract members, canvassed the streets throughout the country in search of children to immunize. They traveled from house to house knocking on doors in shantytowns and rural villages. But gaining entrance to these homes required another round of convincing.

"Côte d'Ivoire has just experienced a conflict and people are still cautious. They don't want to open their door to just anyone," says Richmond-Ahoua. But once they see the polio T-shirts and hats that Rotary clubs supply to identify vaccinators, she says they feel safe opening their doors.

Communication is also key to mobilizing public support. Rotary members use the media, television, radio, and even griots, African tribal storytellers, to encourage participation in immunizations. As a result, 7.5 million children received two drops of oral polio vaccine, along with vitamin A supplements and de-worming tablets, during the NIDs.

Supplementary immunization campaigns like this one are part of the comprehensive 2013-18 Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan. The plan outlines what is needed to eradicate all polio disease by 2018. In June the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced a new fundraising agreement with Rotary. If successful, the campaign, which matches donations two-to-one (up to \$35 million per year), will help raise \$525 million for polio eradication.

"Polio eradication is not an option, it's an obligation," Richmond-Ahoua says. "When you consider what's been done in Côte d'Ivoire, despite the many obstacles we've faced, you are deeply convinced that polio will soon be eradicated." Source: Rotary International




