#### SPEAKERS' CV

#### Louise MILHOMME

First of all, my name is Louise Milhomme, I'm 18 years old. I'm currently an exchange student. I arrived in Malaysia few months ago, last 24<sup>th</sup> of August. I come from France, and more



exactly from the Nord-pas-de-Calais, in north of France. It's just near Belgium, and near UK as well, you just have to cross the Channel.

I live with my mother and my step father. And I have one oldest brother – Paul who is 22 years old, he is military – and also one oldest sister – Chloé, who is 19 years old, she is student in an international business school. And to complete everything I have a dog called *Sam* and a cat called *Le chat* (which means: the cat). And we live in a nice house with a big garden and a river at the end of this one. It's a nice place during the summer because all this space is enjoyable with the sun.

Yes, now it's the moment when I'll talk about the weather.. During the summer we can reach 35°, it's usually around 30°. And during the winter (don't be surprised) we are in the minus degrees. So something around -5° or -10°. But you can survive, you just need warm clothes and it's okay.

I have to say that there my life is completely different than here in Malaysia. First, I live in a small town. So I wasn't really used to the life in a capital, I mean with all this people, with the traffic jam .. And here, everything is a surprised. If I have to defined Malaysia, I'll say that it's one of the uncommon places where people are all really different from each other, but they can manage to live together. And it's quite amazing. Here you can find a mosque, and Indian temple and a Chinese temple side by side. I really love this big mix of cultures that we can find here. And the food.... The food is so good, so varied, so tasty...

At the beginning of this program, you have to choose your host country. And the logical next question is *Why did you choose Malaysia?* - To be honest, I don't know. In France, we have absolutely no idea of what is Malaysia. Some of people don't even know where it is exactly or that it's composed in 2 parts with half of the country in Borneo island. So maybe it's because of this. I mean, I wanted to go somewhere I can discover as much as possible. So with Malaysia, I couldn't expect to discover all I've discovered until now. And I'm so happy to be here. It's like if I was in three countries at the same time: Malaysia, India, China. And I know now that I'm really lucky.

And I also know that I have a lot to discover and to learn until next June – because I'll go back in France on the next 10<sup>th</sup> of June.

I hope that now you know me a little bit more. I'm always free for more questions about me, about my country, or just to discuss.

#### Marie COUTSIERS

I'm 17 years old. I come from the north of France, from a small town called Hazebrouck. I live with my parents

and my younger sister Camille, who is 14 years old. My older sister, Noemie, lives in Lille with her best friend. She is 22 years old. I live in a nice house, spacious and modern, with a garden, we have a nice countryside view. I have two cats.



I'm in a French *Lycée*, which is similar to the A Level programme in Malaysia. I have completed my first year, and when I return to France I will have to complete my final year.

Now, I'm in an exchange programme organized by Rotary International. For the exchange programme, we give Rotary five choices of countries, and Malaysia was not my first choice. However, having been in Malaysia for the past three months, Malaysia has become my first choice.




I'm passionate about photography, and I can spend hours taking pictures like landscapes, monuments and portraits. I have also been riding horses for the past four years.








Subj: Tidying up our Pudu Fixed Deposit Accounts

Dear Pudu Board members,

From the beginning of this Rotary Year in July 2013, we have set up to streamline our Fixed Deposits Accounts. The reasons are that we have all the Fixed Deposits in many banks and in varying amounts as well as that we have no fixed allocation for each of our projects in our capitalised fund.

**FINALLY**, we are able to get all these sorted out and the following will take effect:-

- 1. All Fixed Deposits in ALL banks will be withdrawn and the money re-banked into Public Bank in Fixed Deposits
- 2. The total amount of over RM1.5 million only RM1.5 million will be re-banked in in denominations of RM200,000 (5 sets) and RM100,000 (5 sets).
- 3. The RM1,500,000 in fixed deposits are then assigned to :-
  - Secondary School Scholarship Fund Account RM700,000.00
  - University Grants Account RM250,000.00
  - Vocational Scholarship Fund Account RM150,000.00
  - Jenjarom Old Folks' Home Fund Account RM 100,000.00
  - Emergency Relief Fund Account RM100,000.00
  - International Humanitarian Service Account RM 50,000.00
  - Sister Club Account RM25,000.00
  - Disaster Relief Account RM25,000.00
  - 50th Anniversary Fund RM50,000.00

#### **BENEFITS:**

- 1. The amount in each capitalised fund will not change as only the interest from the fixed deposits will be used by the incoming board for the various projects like scholarship, Jenjarom etc. The amount will not be sufficient and thus the top-up comes from the fund raising project.
- 2. The Treasurer and the Board will know the amount of *Paul* money in each capitalised fund every year.

This is only a draft for your approval. Please feel free to let me have your views. Once the board approves this, then the exercise to close all the bank accounts and rebanked into Public Bank will take effect.






