### Healthy Vision For You8 October 2012

#### Who are Optometrists?

- Optometrists are primary eye health professionals, who examine eyes and provide the necessary solutions.
- All optometrists must hold an optometry degree from local or foreign university, and to be regulated by Malaysia Optical Council under the '1991 Optical Act.'

#### What do Optometrists do?

- Optometrists examine people's eyes to diagnose vision problems, and prescribe spectacles or contact lenses based on the condition diagnosed.
- Optometrists also consult people who have special vision needs such as sports vision, occupational vision and computer vision.
- We may also provide special treatments, such as shortsighted control program, corneal refractive therapy, eye muscle therapy and low-vision rehabilitation.
- We are trained to screen for eye diseases as well, and co-manage with ophthalmologist if additional medical treatment is determined necessary.
- Most importantly, we provide comprehensive eye exam!

#### What is an comprehensive eye exam?

- Vision exam, to check the 'power' of the eye.
- External eye health exam, check on cataracts, corneal health, tears levels etc.
- Interior eye health, check on retina, macula, eye's blood vessels and nerve conditions.
- Eye pressure test, which is essential to screen for glaucoma.
- Eye muscle exam, to make sure the eye muscles are coordinating well.

Vision exam, to check the 'power' of the eye.

External eye health exam, check on cataracts, corneal health, tears levels etc

Interior eye health, check on retina, macula, eye's blood vessels and nerve conditions.

Eye pressure test, which is essential to screen for glaucoma.

Eye muscle exam, to make sure the eye muscles are coordinating well.

#### What happens after eye exam?

- Lifestyle dispensing – We will explain to you about your vision status and discuss with you what you may need to enhance your vision.
- The best advertised eyewear products may not be suitable for you. It has to be based on your eye condition and your needs.
- If you wish to have contact lenses, we may need to proceed for a special session to assess your vision to see which types of contact lens suits you.
- If there's some eye condition within our knowledge, we will treat, if not you will be referred to an eye doctor to be co-managed and cared.

#### Why regular eye exam is important?

- Studies shown that vision is the most important sense that people fear losing. Unlike your teeth, eyes usually don't hurt when something is wrong.
- Early detection and treatment of eye disease, such as glaucoma and diabetic retinopathy can avoid loss of vision.
- Underlying health problems, such as diabetes or high blood pressure, sometimes can be detected via an eye exam!

#### Shortsighted (Myopia)

- Things near to you are clear and objects far away are blurrer.
- Common problem among children.

#### Longsighted (Hypermetropia)

- Things near to you are blurred and objects far away are clearer

#### Astigmatism

- Normal eye without astigmatism is perfectly round, like part of a football.
- If the front of your eye is shaped like a rugby ball, that is called astigmatism

#### Presbyopia

- Commonly known as 'Loh Fah', is where the muscle in your eye which is responsible for near focusing had became weakened due to aging.

#### The aging eye

- Our eyes change when we age and eye disease are more common.
- Common aging eye conditions include cataracts, glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, age related macula degeneration etc.

- Make sure you have regular eye exam, adults over 40 years old are advised to have an eye exam or screening at least twice a year.

Where can I find an Optometrist?

- Not all optical practice and eye clinic in Malaysia are stationed with optometrist.
- As for 2008, there are only totaled of 672 optometrists nationwide.
- So, please ask for an optometrist when you go for an eye examination

\* TIPS: All optometrists registered with Health Ministry are given a GREEN certificate.

### 10 Tips for Good Eye Health

- Regular eye exams!
- Stop smoking!
- Wear spectacles or contact lens if you had been prescribed one!
- Don't look at the sun directly, ever!

- Health diet – Rich in vegetables (especially leafy vegetables), food with Omega-3.
- Don't poke things in your eyes (or other people's eyes)!
- Don't wear other people's spectacles or contact lenses!
- Unless advised, do not sleep or swim with contact lenses! Make sure contact lenses and it's casing are clean!
- Protect your eyes from the sun – wear sunglasses, photochromatic lenses or brim hat!
- Look away from computer screen time to time to rest your eyes, and a pair of computer lenses to assist if needed.

## THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

We understand that the Rotary Foundation is changing its grant model called Future Vision Plan and will start it from 1st July 2013. As funds are limited approved projects must be sustainable. So.....

### What is sustainability and why is it important?

The Rotary Foundation defines sustainability as the capacity for maintaining outcomes over the long term to serve the ongoing need of a community after grant funds have been expended. A sustainable project typically involves local community leaders in planning so that they are invested in the project's long-term success. Training and the exchange of information prepare communities to maintain results and solve problems on their own, after the Rotary club's involvement has ended. Sustainable projects offer enduring value and a greater return on Rotary's investment of money and volunteer hours.

### How does my club or district get qualified?

In order to receive grants from the Foundation, clubs and districts must be qualified. To be qualified, districts must complete an online process and follow the District Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The district governor, governor-elect, and Rotary Foundation committee chair must all three agree to the terms of the MOU.

Once a district is qualified, that district will in turn qualify its clubs. To be qualified, clubs must sign and follow the Club Memorandum of Understanding, send a representative to the district grant management seminar, and meet any other requirements determined by their district.

Is your Attitude,

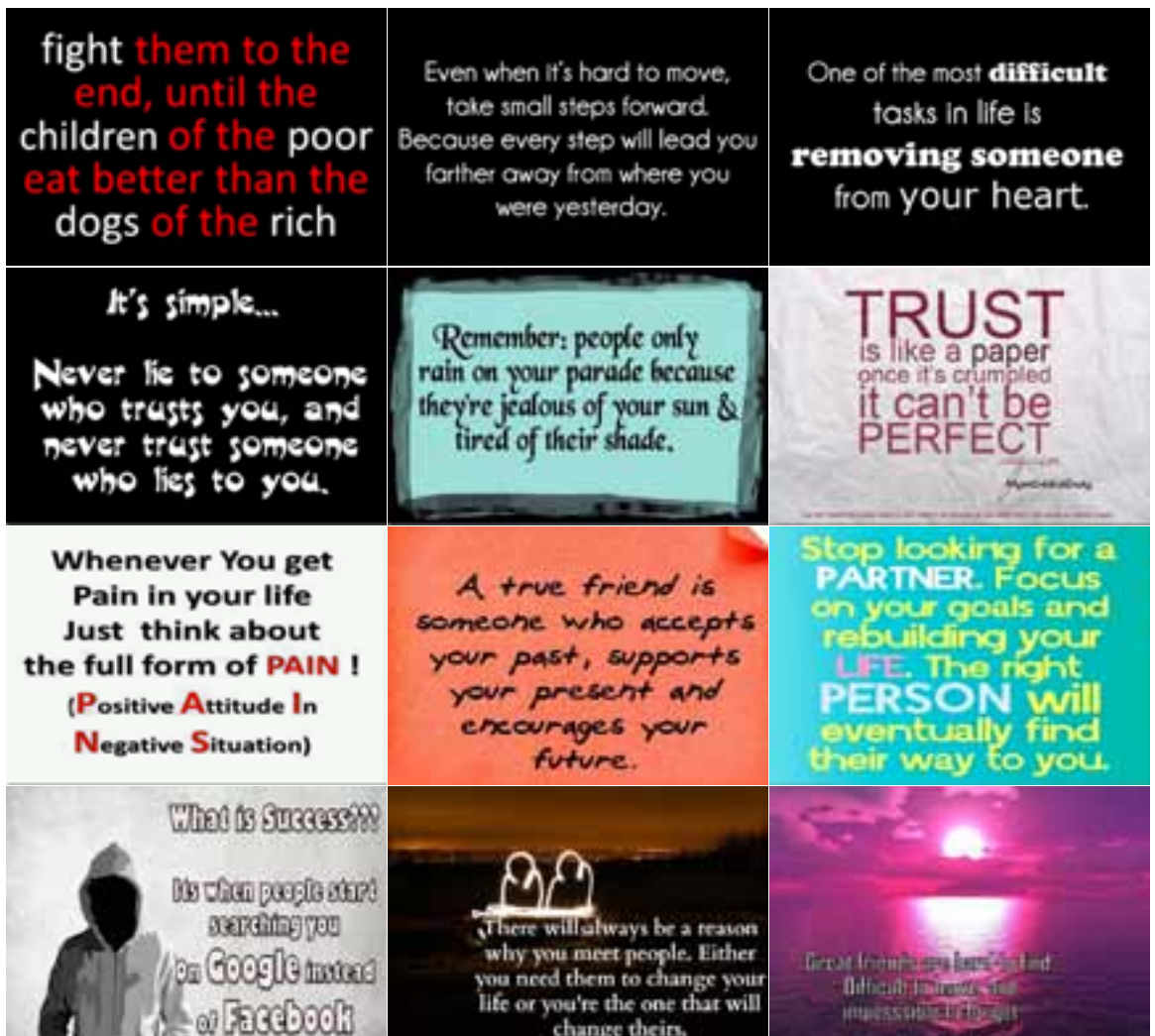
So if you can take care of that, everything else in life becomes much easier.
