- They can be sole proprietor, partnerships or Sdn Bhd.
- Their registration is carry out by Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia and R.O.C. and renewable on a yearly basis.

Role and Demand

- C & S Engineers, play a key role in supporting the country's development projects. They are also a key component to the construction industries.
- They are needed especially in a fast developing countries.
- The demand for c/s engineer is more in a developing countries as compared with the fully develop countries.

Types of Project Normally Undertaken

- Materials strength qualities are verified by asking supplier to submit mill or factory test certificates, on all deliveries.
- Random samples are taken for independent laboratories testing, to further control the quality of building materials.
