Rotary Foundation “provide help to thousands upon thousands of the world’s citizens each and every day”. Rotarians individually and collectively can do much to help out with this mission to provide help where it is needed. On an individual level help can be in many forms and not necessary involving donation as the following story illustrates.

The Editor recently received an email from a friend in New Zealand which he thinks illustrate the meaning of giving and helping. This friend runs her own successful practice in NZ and she wrote to inform “ I am going to visit a rest home (old folks home) and I visit once a week, and today is ‘special’. These elderlies are so lovely and .....I felt ‘young’ around them (ahem!). They seem so full of admiration and some are rather ‘lost’ in their own world. Spending a couple of hours a week with them will actually cheer them up for the whole week (I hope). The best part is you don’t really need a lot of topics to keep the conversation going, one simple topic will last more than 2 hours! Yes, a lot of repetitive dialogues and all of them just couldn’t remember a thing the next time I see them.....they simply have “beautiful mind’.

“I enjoyed their company more than they needed mine (except Amy, none of them remember my name). Last night’s visit was fun, awkward almost. A lady requested me to accompany her to her room and along the way, we picked up a train of elderlies following behind. That thought still put a smile on my face now.... I ended taking a ‘train’ of old people walking around the block, extremely slowly. A little walk will do them good after those rich chocolate cakes! Then a distressed Doreen came and complained that she has been followed by Pat everywhere she goes.....a couple of them tried to sneak out with me when I was leaving.....so adorable. That’ just one of my visits and I can almost write a book about these lovelies!”

A touching story of a person who cares in her own way to make life more pleasant for a group of strangers in a home. Its a reminder to us that each and everyone of us can reach out to help in his/her way even as we consider the wider aspect of the work of the Rotary Foundation.

Personally, this week has been a particularly hectic one for me. A couple of major events that had been in the pipeline for months have finally come to past....

In amongst all these array of activities, I have also been juggling my usual duties at work, my service in church and of course as RC Pudu’s current president.

**LAUNCHING OF MATCHING GRANT # 73289**

We are pleased to inform the members of Rotary Club of Pudu that we have successfully secured a Matching Grant with the joint efforts between RC Singapore West, SHARE (DDF) Contributions: D-3460(Taiwan), D-3300 and The Rotary Foundation. We have received approval from The Rotary Foundation for RM80,968.18 to install computers and other related equipments at the following venues.

Kuil Sree Selva Vinayagar  
Lot: 5976, Jalan Tepi Sungai  
41100 Klang,  
Selangor.

The project involves the setting up of a fully functional computer lab which will be housed at the new premises adjacent to the temple. The lab will be provided with 20 sets table top computers, 20 table & chairs, 2 air-cond units, carpet floor, 2 units printers with scanners, copier and fax together with a 4 feet Whiteboard.

This computer lab will address the digital literacy needs of the rural poor from the surrounding municipal community. About 60 or more students from ages 7 to 12 will acquire computer knowledge on computer and thus will enable them to enhance their academic pursuits.

Apart from the above two secondary schools in the Pudu District will be provided with table top computers and computer aided equipments. The provision of computers to these schools will enable the students to acquire the knowledge

on computer and thus enable them to pursue a vocation in the years ahead.

The temple authorities are arranging a grand welcome ceremony and refreshments will be provided by Klang Samaritans, Selangor.

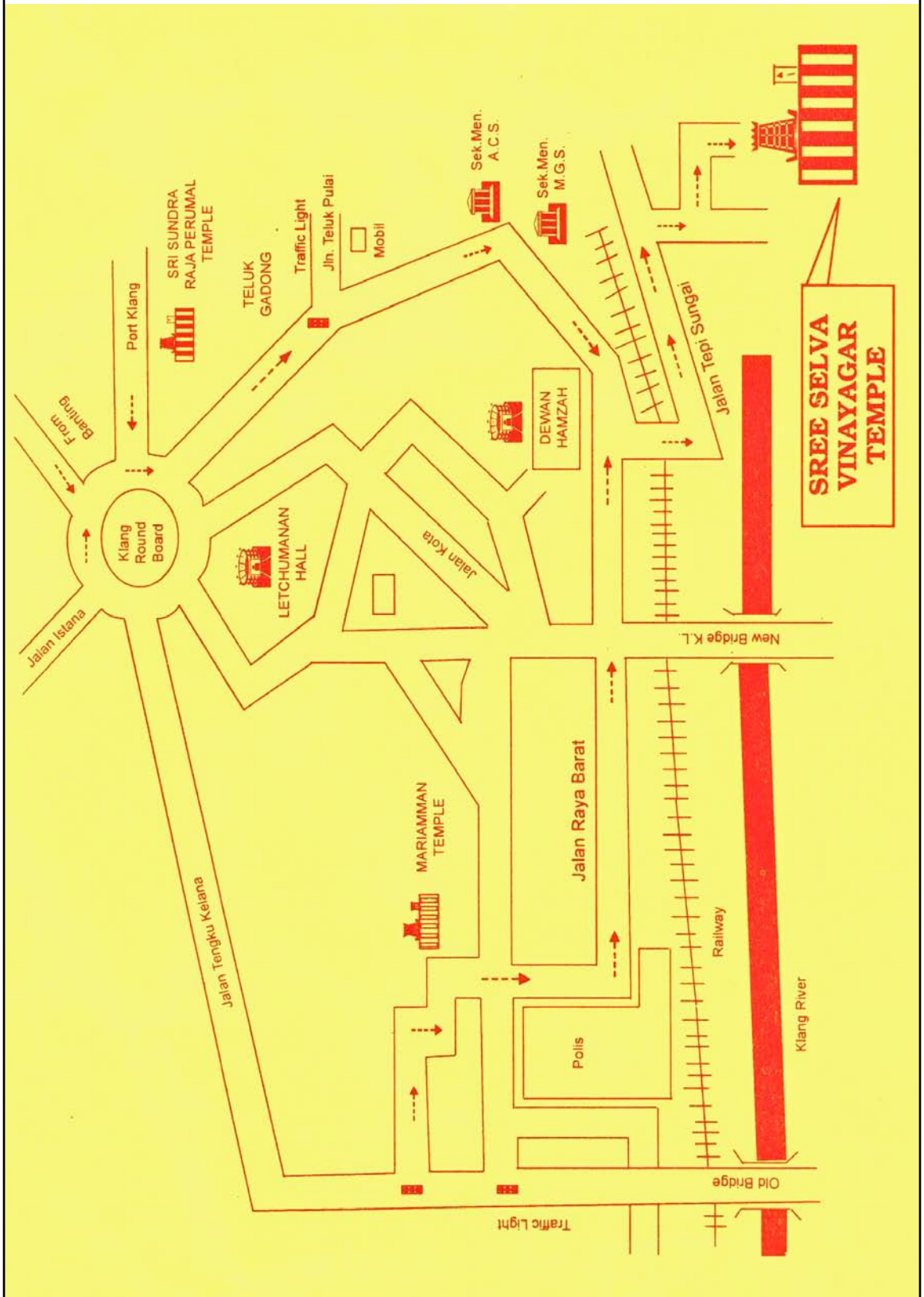

**The RI president's November message - Reach Out to Africa***Ray Klinginsmith*

I was a Rotary Scholar at the University of Cape Town in 1961. During my year there, I traveled 16,000 miles through South Africa and the countries now known as Zimbabwe, Zambia, and Namibia. I visited 35 Rotary clubs, met countless Rotarians, and became immersed in the rich culture of Southern Africa.

During my initial visit, I developed a deep appreciation for both the traditions and the challenges of life in Africa, and my respect and admiration for the land and people have caused me to return several times as a Rotarian. Now – almost amazingly – I have a unique opportunity to use my experience as a Rotary Scholar to enhance the role of Rotary in Africa!

This is the fourth year of the Reach Out to Africa (ROTA) initiative, and the ROTA Committee for this year has been streamlined to move more quickly and efficiently to achieve its goals. We need to increase the number of Rotarians in Africa! I also hope to see a substantial increase in international service projects for Africa, particularly those projects with assistance from The Rotary Foundation. The ROTA Committee has an excellent website, and I encourage all Rotarians to review it at [www.reachouttoafrica.org](http://www.reachouttoafrica.org).

I have implemented two new activities this year to make it easier for Rotarians to visit Africa and to increase their involvement in international service projects. The first is Ray's Rotary Reunions, to be held in Cape Town 3-5 February, and I hope many Rotarians will join me in the Fairest Cape for that event. The second, Rotary Project Safaris, will facilitate visits by Rotarians to the areas of the world where poverty is prevalent, and where local

Rotarians have developed many beneficial projects that need financial assistance. More information about the reunions and the safaris is available on the RI president's pages at [www.rotary.org/president](http://www.rotary.org/president).

**Rotary Information***(By PP VG Chandran)***THE ROTARY FOUNDATION.....PART 2 – TRF SHAPES UP**

- STOCK MARKET CRASH OF 1929, ...donations to good causes dried up
- PAUL HARRIS ASKED THE ROTARY FOUNDATION TO MAKE ITS FIRST DONATION \$500 check to the International Society for Crippled Children
- 1937 RI BOARD ANNOUNCED PLANS FOR A \$2 MILLION FUNDRAISING GOAL

In 1928, delegates to the Minneapolis convention changed the fund's name to The Rotary Foundation. This change in the RI Constitution stipulated that a board of five trustees—all past RI presidents—should govern the new Foundation and that funds should be kept separately from the parent organization. Contributions started to come in; four years later, there was \$50,000 in the bank.

The stock market crash of 1929, donations to good causes dried up. It was then that Paul Harris asked The Rotary Foundation to make its first donation; and it sent a \$500 check to the International Society for Crippled Children.

The 1937 RI Board announced plans for a \$2 million fundraising goal for The Rotary Foundation, and it looked as if Arch Klumph's vision would finally be realized.

The outbreak of World War II dashed those hopes again, but the tragedy of war made Rotarians reflect more seriously on the Foundation's potential for peacemaking. Ches Perry, who had retired as general secretary in 1942, used the pseudonym Perry Reynolds to pen an April 1944 article in *The Rotarian* urging members to donate to the Foundation in addition to their normal Rotary dues. "An additional contribution of \$5 a year by each Rotarian for the next two years would give Rotary International an endowment of two million dollars and make its Foundation an instrument of great good in the post war period," he reasoned.

When the war ended in 1945, Rotary rewrote its objectives for The Rotary Foundation:

1. "The promotion of Rotary Foundation Fellowships for advanced study;
2. The fostering of any tangible and effective projects which have as their purpose the furthering of better understanding and friendly relations between the peoples of different nations; and
3. The providing of emergency relief for Rotarians and their families wherever war or other disaster has brought general destruction and suffering." In 1947, when Paul Harris died, RI asked that individuals and clubs wishing to honour the founder make gifts in his name to The Rotary Foundation, suggesting \$10 per member.

Money poured in from all over the world. Thus, in the first year after Harris's death, the Foundation granted 18 Rotary Foundation Fellowships—later called Ambassadorial Scholarships — for one year's university study abroad.

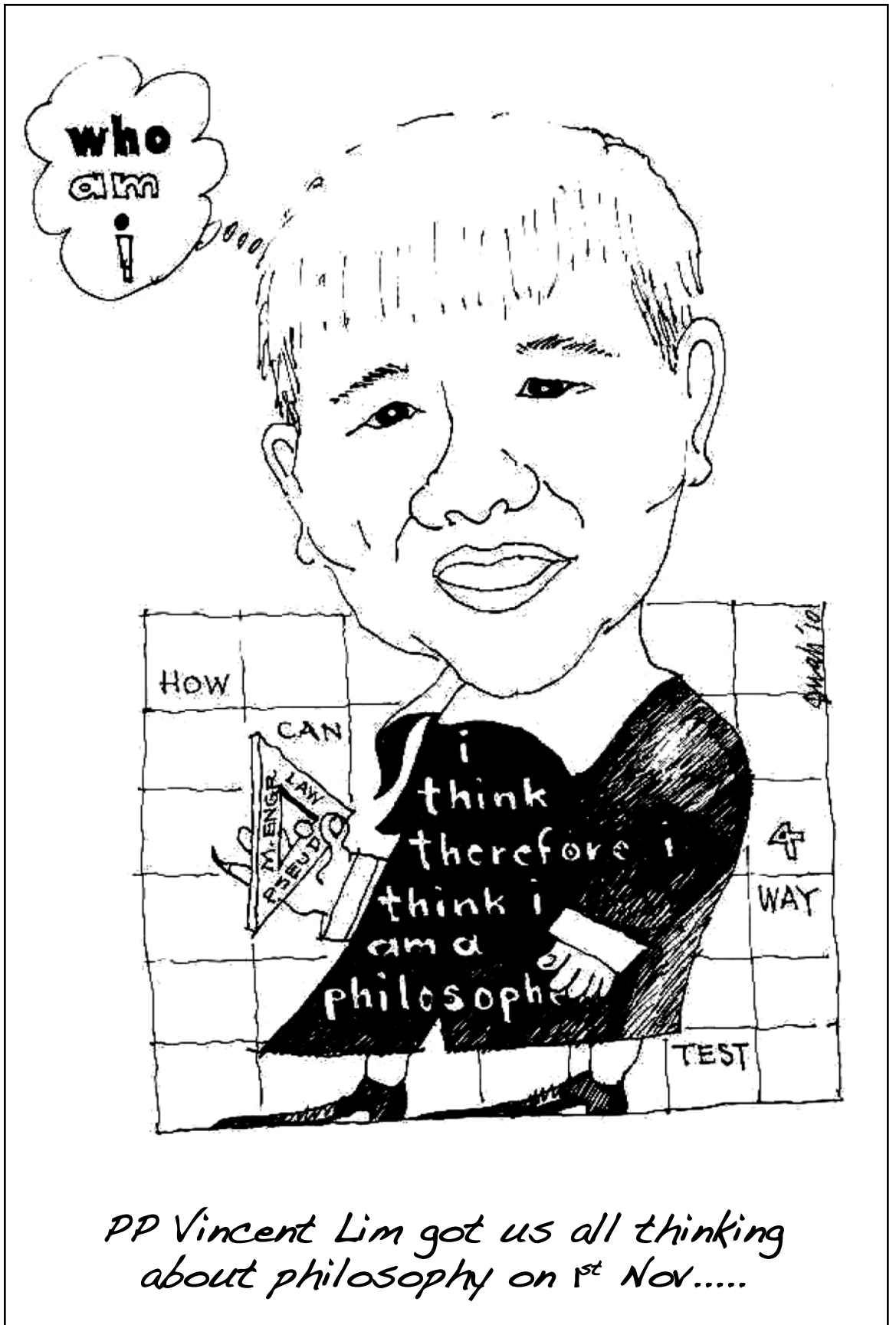
By 1954, the Foundation had collected \$3.5 million—and new contributions reached \$500,000 in a single year. In 1955, Rotary's 50th anniversary year, it awarded scholarships to 494 young men and women from 57 countries. The Rotary Foundation

had quickly become the successful program that Arch Klumph had long predicted. In 1956, the RI Board urged clubs to give further emphasis to the Foundation during The Rotary Foundation Week, which they decreed be held in mid-November each year. The Secretariat suggested that clubs and districts plan programs publicizing the Foundation during that week, and their efforts were so successful that in 1982 the Trustees changed it to The Rotary Foundation Month, still observed every November. This ongoing desire to honour Rotary's founder by making gifts to the Foundation spurred one of the most significant ideas in its history. By 1957, a decade after Paul's death, donations had begun to decline. The Trustees announced that anyone who contributed \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation would become a Paul Harris Fellow. were presented with a plaque, medallion, and lapel pin, all bearing the founder's likeness. In 1968, the Trustees added a category called Sustaining Member for those who could not give the entire \$1,000 at one time but pledged to give \$100 annually. When they attained the \$1,000, they became Paul Harris Fellows. Allison G. Brush, a past RI director from Laurel, Mississippi, USA, was the first Paul Harris Fellow. The second was Rufus F. Chapin, one of the 1905 Chicago members who became the longtime treasurer of Rotary International.

By 1984 there were 100,000 Paul Harris Fellows, a number that swelled to 250,000 in 1989 and 500,000 by 1995.

"The Rotary Foundation is not to build monuments of brick and stone. If we work upon marble, it will perish; if we work on brass, time will efface it; if we rear temples they will crumble into dust; but if we work upon immortal minds, if we imbue them with the full meaning of the spirit of Rotary ... we are engraving on those tablets something that will brighten all eternity."
